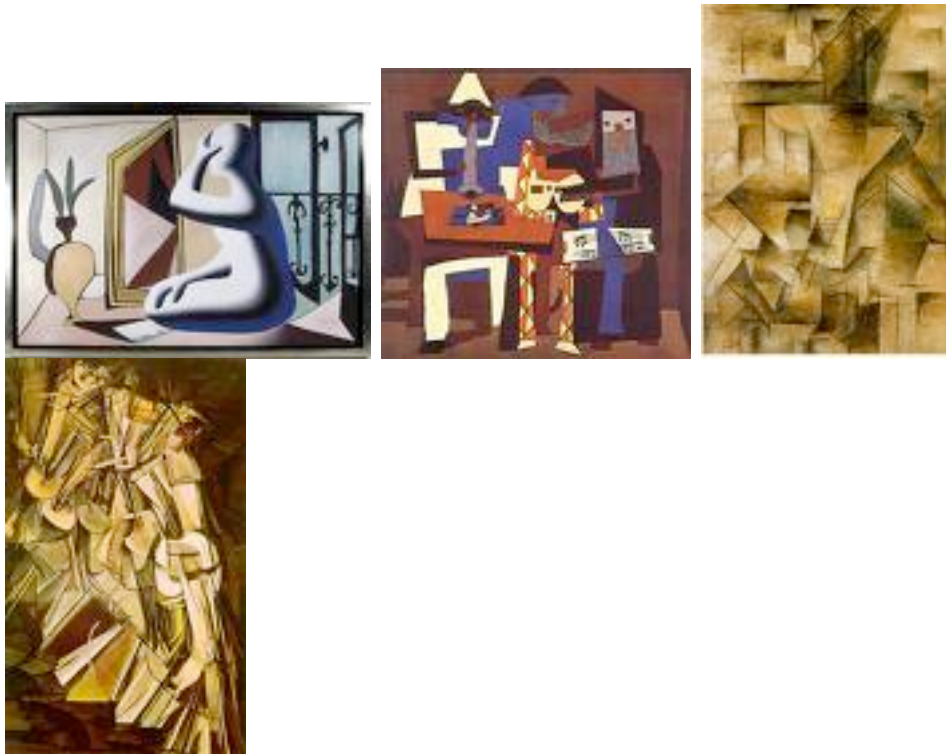


Cubism:

An art style developed in 1908 by Picasso and Braque whereby the artist breaks down the natural forms of the subjects into geometric shapes and creates a new kind of pictorial space. In contrast to traditional painting styles where the perspective of subjects is fixed and complete, cubist work can portray the subject from multiple perspectives.



Cubism and Photography Assignment:

Directions –

Determine your subject matter. Use a digital camera and take multiple pictures of your subject(s) from multiple angles.

Using Adobe Photoshop, create a document 8.5x11 or 11x 8.5 at 100dpi.

Select various geometrical sections from the digital photos and assimilate into a new construction. Experiment with size relationships and use of angles.

Your final composition should display your subject(s) from multiple perspectives.

*As you work, preserve your file as a .psd. When you are finished, save your work as a .jpg / 7 compression.
