

Web Design > CSS Lesson

Objective: Create an external CSS style sheet to be linked up with a .html page from the History of Watertown Project. Style sheet should demonstrate text, image and spatial behavior(s) by defining separate quadrants on your web page.

When producing this style sheet, take advantage of a variety of code references. On the WHS FAPA page there are several links to explore: CSS Basics > CSS Tag Reference > CSS Sample Sheet > HTML Sample Sheet. You can also explore the O’Rielly Code reference option within your Dreamweave application.

When communicating your CSS commands with your .html document, be sure to use appropriate descriptors to communicate both Class level and ID level CSS tags.

Rubrics:

- a. Media Literacy -
Demonstrate your understanding of CSS by creating a functioning CSS/HTML document./
- b. Research -
Demonstrate independent learning by accessing the code reference data outlined above.
- c. Consider range of style attributes -
Your final product should demonstrate both Class level and ID level CSS styles: linked graphics, text behaviors, defined spatial quadrants, borders, padding, margins, background colors, etc.
