Dear Watertown Middle School Families,

We are pleased to share with you the sixth annual Report Card for Watertown Middle School. The federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act requires all states, school districts, and schools to report student assessment results and teacher qualifications to the community on an annual basis. This report card contains information for our school, including Educator Data, Accountability Status, and Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) results. The information in the report card is very detailed, but here is a snapshot for your review:

- *Educator Data:* This includes information about teacher quality as measured by licensure. All of Watertown Middle School's teachers are licensed to teach in Massachusetts and they are highly qualified in their core academic subjects.
- *Accountability Status:* The adequate yearly progress (AYP) report measures whether or not we are meeting a national goal of all students being proficient in English and mathematics by the year 2014. **I am very pleased to announce that for the first time in five years, the middle school has met all of its AYP goals with every grade, in every subject, and with every subgroup.** One more year of meeting all of our goals will mean that we will remove ourselves from our "Needs Improvement" status in English Language Arts and our "Corrective Action" status in mathematics. We are very proud of our improvement; however, we realize we still have a long way to go until we are completely satisfied with our student test scores.
- *MCAS Results:* Watertown Middle School's 2007 MCAS scores have substantially improved over 2006 and 2005 scores in English Language Arts and Mathematics. The State measures a school's MCAS performance through a 100-point Composite Performance Index (CPI). English Language Arts CPI levels are at 89.7, 92.8, and 91.8 for grades 6, 7, and 8, respectively. This represents an average increase of 2.2 CPI points from last year and we are 3.2 CPI points above the state average. Mathematics CPI levels are at 78.9, 76.1, and 76.3 for grades 6, 7, and 8, respectively. This represents an average increase of 4.4 CPI points from last year and we are 5.1 CPI points above the state average. Grade 8 science scores, however, are down 3.7 CPI points, leaving us 2.0 CPI points below the state average.

The purpose of the school report card is to give parents information about their child's school in terms of academic achievement and professional qualifications of its teachers. By making this information available each year, parents will learn how Watertown Middle School is doing.
